

Studying South Asia at UBC?

Take advantage of all the exchange opportunities available

UBC and the University of Washington (UW) have an agreement that helps students share resources across both universities. Here's how to make the most of this opportunity — and more!



Student mobility between UBC and UW

- For graduate* and undergraduate students in any Faculty.
 - Length of study can be a full academic year or one term (but not summer).
 - Students pay the tuition fees of their home institution.
 - Apply through Go Global. Usually, there is less demand than the number of spaces available.
 - May only get one funding award (your highest) for study at UW.
- *Interested graduate students should explore this opportunity with their advisor.



Funding opportunities for exchange study

GO GLOBAL AWARDS

All students that apply to study abroad are automatically considered for the award, which is CAD\$1000 per term.

Top students are considered for a higher award of CAD\$1500 per term.

This award can be used at any UBC partner university globally, including UBC partner universities in South Asia.

CORBETT FELLOWSHIP

Allows exchange study for UW and UBC students who are either US or Canadian citizens or permanent residents.

Currently this fellowship is open only to undergraduates.

Preference is given to students who will study for a full academic year, but students doing a shorter exchange will also be considered.

US\$10,000 for UW students to study at UBC and US\$12,000 for UBC students to study at UW.
